

Active Shooter Training will be Tuesday, March 13th at 6:30 pm in Community Center. Please Come and Learn.




Three Minutes.

- Once notified. Law Enforcement will respond to an Active Shooter as quickly as possible.

 Response time averages about three minutes.

 Your immediate actions should be focused on maximizing your personal safety until Law Enforcement is able to stop the threat.

What You Do Matters.



- Pay attention to your surroundings.
 Have an exit plan.
 Move anway from the source of the threat as quickly as possible.
 The more distance and berriers between you and the threat, the better.

ENY when getting away is difficult or maybe even impossible.

- Keep distance between you and the source.
 Create barriers to prevent or slow down a threat from getting to you.
 Turn the lights off.
 Remain out of sight and quiet by hiding benind large objects and silencing your phone.

EFEND because you have the right to protect yourself.

- If you cannot Avoid or Deny be prepared to defend yourself.
 Be aggressive and committed to your actions.
 Do not fight fairly. THES IS ABOUT SURVIVAL.

CALL 911 when you are in a safe area. Inform the 911 operator that this is an active shooter situation.

When Law Enforcement arrivas, SHOW YOUR HANDS AND FOLLOW COMMANDS.

The Epistle Reading - Sunday, March 11, 2018

Save your people, O Lord, and bless your inheritance. I will appeal to you, O Lord our God.

The reading is from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Hebrews (4:14-16 5:1-6).

Brethren, since we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. For we have not a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

For every high priest chosen from among men is appointed to act on behalf of men in relation to God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He can deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is beset with weakness. Because of this he is bound to offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. And one does not take the honor upon himself, but he is called by God, just as Aaron was.

So also Christ did not exalt himself to be made a high priest, but was appointed by him who said to him, "Thou art my Son, today I have begotten thee"; as he says also in another place, "Thou art a priest for ever, after the order of Melchizedek."

The Gospel Reading - Sunday, March 11, 2018

The Reading is from Mark 8:34-38; 9:1

The Lord said: "If anyone wishes to come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever would save his life will lose it; and whoever loses his life for my sake and the gospel's will save it. For what does it profit a man, to gain the whole world and forfeit his life? For what can a man give in return for his life? For whoever is ashamed of me and my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him will the Son of man also be ashamed, when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels." And he said to them, "Truly, I say to you, there are some standing here who will not taste death before they see the kingdom of God come with power."
