The Epistle Reading - Sunday, March 25, 2018

The Reading is from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Hebrews (2:11-18)

Brethren, the sanctifier, and the sanctified are all of one nature: therefore he is not ashamed of calling them brethren and saying, "I will declare your name to my brethren; in the midst of the church I will sing your praise". And again, "I and my children whom God has given me".

Now, since children have blood and flesh in common, so he likewise has shared in the same, that through death he might destroy the one who had the power of death, that is, the devil; and might deliver those who throughout their life were kept in slavery by the fear of death. For of course it is not angels he is assisting, but the offspring of Abraham. Wherefore it was right that he should in all things be made in the likeness of his brethren, so that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest before God to expiate the people's sins. For because he himself has suffered and was tempted, he is able to help those who are tempted.

The Gospel Lesson - Sunday, March 25, 2018

The Reading is from the Holy Gospel according to St. Luke the Evangelist (1:24-38)

In those days Elizabeth, the wife of Zechariah conceived and she secluded herself for five months, saying, "Thus has the Lord dealt with me in the days when he deigned to take away my reproach among men". Now in the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a town of Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the house of David, and the virgin's name was Mary. And when the angel had come to her, he said, "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you. Blessed are you among women". When she had heard him she was troubled at his word, and kept pondering what manner of greeting this might be. And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found grace with God. Behold, you shall conceive in your womb and shall bring forth a son; and you shall call his name Jesus. He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord God will give him the throne of David his father, and he shall be king over the house of Jacob forever; and of his kingdom there shall be no end". But Mary said to the angel, "How shall this happen, since I do not know man"? And the angel answered and said to her, "The Holy Spirit shall come upon you and the power of the Most High shall overshadow you; and therefore the Holy One to be born shall be called the Son of God. And behold, Elizabeth your cousin also has conceived a son in her old age, and she who was called barren is now in her sixth month; for nothing shall be impossible with God". But Mary said, "Behold the handmaid of the Lord; be it done to me according to your word". And the angel left her.
