Apolytikion of the Feast of the Presentation

Χαΐφε, κεχαφιτωμένη Θεοτόκε Παφθένε· ἐκ σοῦ γὰφ ἀνέτειλεν ὁ ἥλιος τῆς δικαιοσύνης, Χφιστὸς ὁ Θεὸς ἡμῶν, φωτίζων τοὺς ἐν σκότει. Εὐφφαίνου καὶ σύ, πφεσβῦτα δίκαιε, δεξάμενος ἐν ἀγκάλαις τὸν ἐλευθεφωτὴν τῶν ψυχῶν ἡμῶν χαφιζόμενον ἡμῖν καὶ τὴν ἀνάστασιν.

Lady full of grace, rejoice, O Virgin Theotokos, for Christ our God, the Sun of righteousness has risen from you and He illumined those in darkness. And you, righteous Elder, be glad in heart, receiving in your embraces the One who liberates our souls and bestows on us the Resurrection.

Resurrection Apolytikion of the tone of the week (Plagal 4)

Έξ ὕψους κατῆλθες ὁ εὔσπλαγχνος, ταφὴν κατεδέξω τοιήμεοον, ἵνα ήμᾶς ἐλευθεοώσης τῶν παθῶν. Ἡ ζωὴ καὶ ἡ Ἀνάστασις ήμῶν, Κύοιε δόξα σοι.

You descended from on high, O compassionate One, and condescended to be buried for three days, so that from the passions You might set us free. Our life and resurrection, O Lord, glory be to You.

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Apolytikion of Saint Photios

Ώς τῶν Ἀποστόλων ὁμότροπος καὶ τῆς Οἰκουμένης διδάσκαλος, τῷ Δεσπότη τῶν ὅλων ἱκέτευε, Φώτιε, εἰρήνην τῆ Οἰκουμένη δωρήσασθαι, καὶ ταῖς ψυχαῖς ἡμῶν τὸ μέγα ἔλεος.

Resembling the Apostles in way of life, O Photios, the teacher of the universe, intercede with the Master of all, to grant peace to the whole world, and great mercy to our souls.

Apolytikion for Memorial Services

Μνήσθητι Κύριε ος αγαθός του (της, των) δούλος (δουλής, δούλων) σου, και όσα εν βίω ήμαρτεν (ήμαρτων), συγχώρησον, ουδείς γαρ αναμάρτητος, ει μή Συ ο δυνάμενος, και τῶ (τῆ, τοῖς) μεταστάντι (μεταστάση, μεταστᾶσι) δούναι την ανάπαυσιν

Remember, O Lord, as You are good, Your Servant(s), and forgive every sin he (she, they) has (have) committed in this life. For no one is sinless except for You, Who has power to grant rest to those who have fallen asleep.

Apolytikion of our Church

As liberator of captives, defender of the poor, physician of the ailing, and champion of Kings, beseech Christ our God, O great martyr George, Standard Bearer, for the salvation of our souls.

Kontakion of the Feast

Ό μήτραν παρθενικὴν άγιάσας τῷ τόκῳ σου καὶ χεῖρας τοῦ Συμεὼν εὐλογήσας, ὡς ἔπρεπε, προφθάσας καὶ νῦν ἔσωσας ἡμᾶς, Χριστὲ ὁ Θεός· Ἀλλ΄ εἰρήνευσον ἐν πολέμοις τὸ πολίτευμα καὶ κραταίωσον βασιλεῖς, οὕς ἠγάπησας, μὸνος φιλάνθρωπος

The Epistle Reading - Sunday, February 6, 2022

The Reading is from St. Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians 6:16-18; 7:1

BRETHREN, you are the temple of the living God; as God said, "I will live in them and move among them, and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. Therefore come out from them, and be separate from them, says the Lord, and touch nothing unclean; then I will welcome you, and I will be a father to you, and you shall be my sons and daughters, says the Lord Almighty." Since we have these promises, beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from every defilement of body and spirit, and make holiness perfect in the fear of God.

The Gospel Lesson - Sunday, February 6, 2022

Sunday of the Canaanite Woman The Reading is from Matthew 15:21-28

At that time, Jesus went to the district of Tyre and Sidon. And behold, a Canaanite woman from that region came out and cried, "Have mercy on me, O Lord, Son of David; my daughter is severely possessed by a demon." But he did not answer her a word. And his disciples came and begged him, saying, "Send her away, for she is crying after us." He answered, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." But she came and knelt before him, saying, "Lord, help me." And he answered, "It is not fair to take the children's bread and throw it to the dogs." She said, "Yes, Lord, yet even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their master's table." Then Jesus answered her, "O woman, great is your faith! Be it done for you as you desire." And her daughter was healed instantly.

Ὁ δὲ ἀποκριθεὶς εἶπεν, Οὐκ ἔστιν καλὸν λαβεῖν τὸν ἄρτον τῶν τέκνων καὶ βαλεῖν τοῖς κυναρίοις. Ἡ δὲ εἶπεν, Ναί, Κύριε, καὶ γὰρ τὰ κυνάρια ἐσθίει ἀπὸ τῶν ψιχίων τῶν πιπτόντων ἀπὸ τῆς τραπέζης τῶν κυρίων αὐτῶν. Τότε ἀποκριθεὶς ὁ Ἰησοῦς εἶπεν αὐτῆ, ὧ γύναι, μεγάλη σου ἡ πίστις· γενηθήτω σοιώς θέλεις. καὶ ἰάθη ἡ θυγάτηρ αὐτῆς ἀπὸ τῆς ὥρας ἐκείνης.

"I SHALL BRING UPON THE EARTH A FLOOD"

he story of NOAH and the great Flood is one of the best known of all biblical tales. We read in the Book of Genesis concerning the wickedness and corruption of mankind that existed during that period of time. An angry God issued a warning: repent and correct your ways, or suffer the consequences. After 120 years passed without any change in man's attitude and actions, the Creator of all decided to destroy the works of His hands by sending a flood upon the earth.

Among the entire human race, only Noah and his family remained faithful to God. For their obedience and loyalty, God promised to spare their lives. Noah was instructed to build an ark, which would provide safety for him, his family and two of every species of animal and bird when the rains came. The dimensions of the ark are astounding: 450 feet long, 75 feet wide and 45 feet high!

For 40 days and nights the rain fell, destroying everyone and everything except those in the ark. After some 150 days, the waters slowly began to recede. The ark came to rest on the mountains of Ararat, which are located in present-day Turkey. Still, Noah remained in the ark. After a year had passed, he released a dove from the ark. That evening, the dove returned with a branch from an olive tree in its beak as a sign of God's reconciliation with mankind. After waiting 7 days, Noah released the dove again. When it did not return, Noah knew that it had found a home. The earth was dry again! Noah and his family left the ark and immediately offered a sacrifice to God. In return, God blessed His righteous servant, and promised never to destroy the world with a flood again, sealing His promise by sending a beautiful rainbow! We should note that nearly all ancient civilizations give some account of the world-wide flood in their writings.
