### Resurrectional Hymn in the Grave Tone

You destroyed death by Your Cross, You opened Paradise to the Robber. You turned the Myrrh-bearing Women's lament into joy, and You commanded Your Apostles to preach that You rose, O Christ God, granting the world the great mercy.

## SCRIPTURE READINGS

#### **Ephesians 2:14-22**

Brethren, Christ is our peace, who has made us both one, and has broken down the dividing wall of hostility, by abolishing in his flesh the law of commandments and ordinances, that he might create in himself one new man in place of the two, so making peace, and might reconcile us both to God in one body through the cross, thereby bringing the hostility to an end. And he came and preached peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near; for through him we both have access in one Spirit to the Father. So then you are no longer strangers and sojourners, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone, in whom the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord; in whom you also are built into it for a dwelling place of God in the Spirit.

And he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns, and build larger ones; and there I will store all my grain and my goods. And I will say to my soul, 'Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; take your ease, eat, drink, be merry.' But God said to him, 'Fool! This night your soul is required of you; and the things you have prepared, whose will they be?' So is he who lays up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God." As he said these things, he cried out: "He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

Reflections on Luke 12:16-21 from St. Basil the Great

12: 18 "'I will take down my storehouses'. You do rightly. I would say the same myself. For well worthy of destruction are the storehouses of injustice. Tear down with your own hands what you have so unjustly built up. Destroy those granaries from which no one returns comforted. Throw down the roofs. Demolish the walls. Expose the withered corn to the sun. Lead from their prison the riches held fast in bonds. Open to the world the dark caves of mammon!

His heart is tormented, devoured with anxiety. For what rejoices others brings pain to the avaricious. He does not rejoice at his storehouses stuffed full. The overflowing riches which his storehouses are unable to hold are a torment to his soul, lest perhaps the overflow should bring some of their blessing to those in want!"

12:19 "Do not sell at high prices and take advantage of those and want. Beware of waiting for a famine before you open your storehouses. Do not look to famine to make money, nor to the common want for your private gain. Do not become a dealer in human misery. Do not try to make money out of the anger of God. You with your eyes ever on money, do you never take a look at your fellow man? You know well the face of a coin, and you can tell a true from a false one, but you know not your brother in his time of need."

12:20 "you are in dread lest other men should have a share in the fruit you possess. You take thought within your unworthy soul, not as to how you will give the poor what they hunger for, but how you, take everything, may deprive all others of the help of them. They stood near him who would demand his soul of him; and he took thought within himself of food! That very night he was snatched away — indeed, just when he had begun to imagine to himself the

delights and the enjoyment of his possessions! It was permitted him to take thought of everything, to make known openly what was in his mind, that he might receive a sentence worthy of his character.

12:21 "Are you not a grasper of everything? Are you not a robber? You who treat as absolutely yours what you receive that you might dispense to others. He who strips another man of his clothing, is he not called a robber? And he who does not clothe the naked when he could, should he not be called the same?


That bread you hold in your clutches, that belongs to the starving.

Those shoes that are going to waste with you, they belong to the barefooted.


The silver you buried away, that belongs to the needy.

### ~:~ GREGORY THE WONDERWORKER ~:~

regory the Wonderworker is often referred to as a "Second Moses." Born in the city of Pontus of wealthy and eminent parents in 203 A.D. Gregory, whose given name was Theodore, grew up receiving the best of educations. He was extremely interested in philosophy, but somehow felt the Greek and Egyptian thought of his time was not complete or fulfilling for his intellectual needs. He went off to study in Alexandria, where he fell under the influence of Origen and other Christian teachers. The young scholar soon embraced Christianity and was baptized into the faith, taking the name of Gregory.

By the time Gregory returned to his home region of Neocaesarea, he had but one goal to fulfill: winning souls for Christ. A gathering of fellow Christians found that they were only 17 in number! Indeed, Gregory had his work cut out for him. A lesser man would have been discouraged, but Gregory was not a lesser man! He was consecrated bishop and soon his tiny flock began to grow. It is said that Gregory had the power to drive away evil spirits and to heal illnesses and diseases. When a plague hit Asia Minor in 253 A.D., Gregory tirelessly ministered to those suffering its effects. His inspiring example led to the conversion of thousands of pagans.

Gregory fell asleep in the Lord in 270 A.D. At the time of his death, the spiritual environment of his city had been completely reversed. Now there were only 17 pagans to be found in what this "Second Moses" had molded into a vibrant Christian community.
